



Report of Observance of World Environment Day Dated 05/06/2021





Report on UTSARG UTSAV Birthday Celebration



The event aimed at generating awareness of blood donation, especially at scrapping of replacement blood therapy amongst family members and familiar circles, which do not take notice of any health issues and complicacies of blood donors. It was designed to encourage all viewers for their voluntary participation in the mission of blood donation through blood banks. The event was an edutainment in nature. It was a judicious combination of educational programme on the importance of blood donation through deliberation of speeches made by medical experts as well as the faculties and students of the college and cultural programme in the form of songs and dances. The moderator of the event was K. Dipika Singha, Assistant Professor from the faculty of Commerce, Lala Rural College. She conducted the programme in its entirety. She initiated the programme by highlighting the importance of blood donation and its impact on the society. The programme then began with the National Anthem chanted gracefully by a group of students followed by the delightful rendition of the welcome song by Puja Nath, a student of the college; then followed the college sangeet harmoniously presented by both teachers and students together, namely Dr. Manas Sinha, Ms. Anuradha De and Dr. Lakshmi Nath along with students, namely Bina Singha, Sangeeta Singha, Julan Dhusad, Supriya Singha etc. The Principal of the college, Dr. Tanuj Kumar Dey, in his welcome speech, greeted all the guests and the viewers and appealed to youths to come forward irrespective of caste, language and religion to donate blood voluntarily as it is a noble act bordering on the true essence of humanity. Then a virtual tour of the college and its campus was viewed. Mr. Gautam Chandra Banik, HOD, Commerce on being called upon spoke on the value of blood by saying, blood knows no gender, no language, no race, no religion; blood cannot be created in a laboratory nor can be created artificially by any scientist; he concluded by appealing students to pledge to donate one unit of blood on their respective birthdays. She made an emphasis in her speech to evade the replacement therapy of blood donation and opt for the blood bank to make it self-sufficient to meet the need of blood for the needy patients. Then another guest, Sanjoy Prakash Das, an "A" grade Tabla player and a Staff Artist, All India Radio, Silchar with her daughter, Jnanashree Das playing a harmonium presented a splendid display of a tabla-harmonium jugalbandi enthralling all viewers. The last speaker of the evening was Dr. Rajiv Biswas, Assistant Professor, Blood Bank, Silchar Medical College & Hospital, Silchar who actively coordinated the program from the Blood Bank. He elaborately talked on the nuances of blood, especially hemoglobin and plasma and their notion and effect from a patient's perspective. He too emphasised on the abolition of blood replacement therapy and insisted all viewers on taking part in this campaign of blood donation through blood banks. 





Report on Special Camp

Dated 15/03/2022

The NSS Unit of Lala Rural College organised a seven-day Special Camp at Singalla Basti on 9th March 2022. As the locality was on the outskirts of the town of Lala and inhabited by needy communities, the unit set up the special camp there. The camp was centred at Ayodhya Rai Memorial High School located at the rural background of Singalla Basti. In the inaugural address, Dr. Manas Sinha, Programme Officer of the unit, conveyed the aim and purpose of the camp. He said that the camp was designed to instil the idea of social welfare in volunteers and to provide services to the society, especially here to the under-privileged locality of Singalla Basti and to identify the needs and problems of the local community. Then Mr. Rupnarayan Roy, President of the school assured the unit of the full cooperation and assistance to the desired effect. Before that, Dr Tanuj Kumar Dey, Principal of the college flagged off the camp. The theme of the camp was 'Youth for holistic development'. On the first day of the camp, the student-volunteers conducted with the aid of questionnaires a survey of the socio-economic conditions of people residing at Singalla Basti. In the process, the volunteers made door-to-door visits to households of the locality. The other noteworthy activities done throughout the week-long camp were Health camp, Plantation, Cleanliness Drive and Anti-Tobacco Awareness programme. The Health Camp was arranged in collaboration with Lala Primary Health Centre headed by Dr. Jahidul Islam and Dr. Mangan Sana Senjam. As many as 92 people were administered free medical check-up and provided free medicines. Then an awareness program was held on the issue of the ills of tobacco consumption. The volunteers conducted a first-hand survey on the issue by paying visits to households of the locality and incorporated data in specific questionnaires. Thereafter, the importance of an eco-friendly environment was highlighted and the need of plantation was emphasized. To this effect, some hundred saplings were distributed to households and volunteers themselves planted the saplings along with the local people. The camp drew special attention to issues related to education, health, plantation and the like. The camp ended on 15th March with a pledge of rendering voluntary community services in the coming days.

Report of Observance of World Environment Day Dated 05/06/2021


