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


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

<u>5 Days Vocational Training Programme on Cutting and Tailoring organised by Vocational Training & Life Skill Development Cell, IOAC, Lala Rural College, Lala</u>

With a small step taken towards skill development and making the students self-sufficient this 5 Days Vocational Training Programme on Cutting and Tailoring was organised by Vocational Training & Life Skill Development Cell, IQAC, Lala Rural College, Lala from 27th May to 31st May, 2022 in the premises of the college.

Inauguration of the programme was held on 27th May, 2022 at Old Library Building of the college and the inaugural session began at 11.00 a.m. with the welcome address by Dr. Sonali Roy, Convenor, Vocational Training & Life Skill Development Cell, IQAC, followed by the inaugural speech by Dr. Ng. Dayamoy Singha, HoD, Department of History. He emphasized on the significance of skill development and how necessary it is for every student to earn their livelihood independently.

The course was a meticulously designed tailoring course for beginners. Ms. Moonmoon Kangsabanik was hired as the instructor for the programme with arrangement of one stitching machine. The instructor was chosen based on her experience, qualification and her self-motivation to teach students. A total of 22 students, both from Arts and Commerce Stream, participated in the programme. In this course the basics of tailoring, which included how to take measurement, how to choose the right fabrics, and how to cut and sew a basic garment like blouse and kurti was taught. On the last day of the programme the students exhibited their skill of stitching, whatever they have learned from this vocational training programme and were also given participation certificates.

The valedictory session started from 2.30 p.m on 31st May, 2022 with the speech of Dr. Tanuj Kumar Dey, Principal i/c. The speech elucidated on the importance of imparting employability skills along with the process of holistic development of the students. The programme wrapped up around 4:30 p.m. with the vote of thanks from the Convener. The college authority had given tremendous support and co-ordination in making this event successful.

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

The activities of Vocational Training and Life Skill Development Cell for the session 2022-2023 are as follows:

Report on the IBM Skills Build Orientation Workshop

The Assistant Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Hailakandi, organized a one-day Orientation Programme on Youth Multi-Purpose Coop: Societies & Employment Generation on 06th April, 2023 for the undergraduate students in collaboration with Vocational Training & Life Skill Development Cell and Career Counseling Cell, IQAC, Lala Rural College. The programme commenced with a welcome note delivered by Mrs. Deepmala Paul, Convener, Career Counseling Cell, at around 11.30 a.m. at Auditorium Hall. This was followed by an inaugural speech by Dr. Himabrata Chakrabarty, Principal, Lala Rural College.
