Report on the Protest March against the heinous act of rape and murder of a young girl named Kinirung Reang.

As per the resolutions taken in the meeting of Women's cell, IQAC held on 20th March 2018, a team of teachers including Dr Ng. Dayamay Singha, Co-ordinator of IQAC, Gautam Chandra Banik, Programme Officer of NSS unit, Dr S. Bebita Devi, Convenor of Women's cell visited, on 23rd March, 2018, the house and family of a wretched victim of a gang-rape cum murder at Betcherra taken place on 14th March 2018 with a mission of condemning the inhuman act of rape and brutal murder of Kinirung Reang, a young tribal girl. An amount of Rs.23,000 as a financial aid from the college family including the teaching fraternity, students and office bearers was handed over to the bereaved family.

Besides, in order to mark the protest against the heinous crime in Betcherra, a rally was also organized by Women's cell in collaboration with NSS on 24th March 2018 in which a good number of students and teaching staff took part spontaneousely. In this regard a memorandum was also submitted to the D.C. of Hailakandi to take the immediate severe action for such kind of inhuman act so that such crime cannot be repeated in future. The protest march was later followed by a prayer for the departed soul of the innocent Kinirung Reang.







Report on Special Camp

Dated 15/03/2022

The NSS Unit of Lala Rural College organised a seven-day Special Camp at Singalla Basti on 9th March 2022. As the locality was on the outskirts of the town of Lala and inhabited by needy communities, the unit set up the special camp there. The camp was centred at Ayodhya Rai Memorial High School located at the rural background of Singalla Basti.
