



A one day webinar on Investor Awareness on Commodity Derivatives Market was organized by Department of Commerce, Lala Rural College in collaboration with NCDEX (National Commodity Derivatives Exchange Limited) Investor Protection Fund Trust on 31st August, 2021 via Google Meet.
