#### Introduction

Lala Rural College is a premier academic institution set up way back in 1964 in a rural setting. It is located at Lala, a small town in the district of Hailakandi in the southernmost region of Assam. The College, affiliated to Assam University, a central university, offers courses in both Arts & Commerce at Secondary and Degree level.

The college has been providing affordable and accessible education over the years to the young generation of ethnic diversity in the locality and its surroundings. Once held in the premises of Lala H.S. & M.P. School in the initial stage, classes shifted to its own building with the help of the generous donation of the locality and the members of the staff in close proximity to the bank of river Dhaleswari. The College has as of now eleven buildings including a Conference Hall (donated), a spacious Library and Auditorium. The college has two separate blocks for two streams -- Arts and Commerce respectively.

The college was affiliated to the Gauhati University since its inception. It has achieved a spectacular growth since 1975 when the Govt. of Assam brought it under deficit Grants-in-Aid system. Lala Rural College is now in the prestigious band of permanently affiliated colleges under Assam University. The College has been provincialized by the Govt. of Assam in the year 2005. The College is recognized under Section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

As per the Govt. directives, from the academic session 2023-24, Lala Rural College shifts from CBCS to multidisciplinary education structure with skill and experiential component in a four-year UG programme as envisaged in the NEP 2020 facilitating multiple entry and multiple exit (MEME) to students.

#### Mission

The mission of Lala Rural College is to ensure academic excellence and professional competence for learners. In line with the idea of the NEP 2020, the college strives to achieve holistic development of individuals through academic pursuit and co-curricular activities centred on inquiry-based, discovery-based, discussion-based, and interactive and analysis-based *learning*. The college aims to flourish a knowledge system fostering the spirit of learning, reflection, and sharing toward capacity building with special focus on development of physical, emotional and cognitive abilities among students.

#### Vision

Lala Rural College envisions an educational ecosystem prioritizing holistic development, technology integration, and research-driven learning, enabling learners to drive for educational growth and societal progress. Imparting value-based education to the students and thereby socially uplifting them in order to keep pace with the changing needs and trends is one key objective. The college reflects on promoting regional multilingualism and the power of language, ancient knowledge creativity, critical thinking, ethics, human values, equity and inclusion, and life skills during the teaching and learning process thereby making students global citizens while retaining Indian ethos.

#### **Code of ethics for the Students**

Students of the college are expected to devote their energy in learning and developing awholesome personality. The students would:

- 1. Abides by Acts. Rules, policies, procedures of the college and respect its ideals, vision, mission, cultural practices and the traditions.
- 2. Remain punctual, disciplined and regular in attending class lectures, tutorials and research.
- 3. Observe modesty in their overall appearance and behaviour.
- 4. Behave with dignity and courtesy with teachers, staff and fellow students.
- 5. Act as role models for junior students by attaining the highest level of values and morality.
- 6. Maintain harmony among students belonging to different socio-economic statuses, communities, castes, religions and regions.
- 7. Contribute towards cleanliness of the campus and its surroundings. Show respect and care for the institutional properties.
- 8. Observe proper behaviour while on educational tour/visit or excursion.
- 9. Be honest in providing truthful information about all documents.
- 10. Help teachers in maintaining learning environment conducive for all students.
- 11. Strive to keep campus ragging free.
- 12. Be sensitive to gender issues.
- 13. Maintain good health and refrain from any kind of intoxicants.

#### **General Rules**

- 1. Application for change of subject(s) required to be made to the Principal through the respective HOD(s) within one month from the date of admission. Application received thereafter, will not be accepted.
- 2. All kinds of college dues are payable on or before the dates notified from time to time.
- 3. Student, who fails to deposit his/ her dues within specified period, will be declared defaulter and his/ her name shall be dropped from the College Roll. Under such circumstances he or she may be re-enrolled on request at the discretion of the Principal on payment of re-admission fees along with other arrear dues.
- 4. Applications for College Certificate/ Transfer Certificate etc. duly countersigned by the guardians shall have to be submitted with a fee of Rs. 100/- only.
- 5. Notices desired to be pasted or circulated by the students shall require prior approval of the Principal.
- 6. Use of mobile phones within the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 7. The College will follow Govt. reservation rules for admission of students.
- 8. All powers for maintaining rules and regulations are vested with the Principal and his decision will be final in all such matters.

#### **Special Features**

The college can legitimately boast for its teaching staff. Teachers have been participating in National and International Seminars regularly. Most of the faculty members have Ph.D. and or M.Phil. Degree. Some have authored a number of books and contributed articles in research journals of national and international repute. Many teachers have undertaken Minor Research Project (MRP) from UGC. A good number of teachers have obtained Ph.D. from different Universities. Many teachers are also invited as Resource Persons in different departments and institutions for academic purposes.

- 1. Modern method of Teaching and Educational technology including Audio-visual equipment is used in the classrooms. Smart class rooms are an added feature.
- 2. Online Classes and communication via WhatsApp, Google Classroom, and Google Meet and so on based on the convenience of the Teachers and Students.
- 3. Teacher-student relationship is exemplary.
- 4. Academic calendar is strictly followed in teaching-learning activities.
- 5. Distribution of curriculum among the teachers of the department in the beginning of each academic session is mandatory for all the respective HOD's.
- 6. Special care for slow learners and dropouts through motivational sessions and remedial classes.
- 7. Special care for advanced learners by providing additional inputs for better career planning and growth through offering special coaching for higher level competitive examinations.

#### An overview of NEP 2020

The National Education Policy of India 2020 (NEP 2020), approved by the Union Cabinet of India on 29 July 2020, is the third education policy and the first of the 21st century. It replaces the previous National Policy on Education, 1986. The NEP 2020 is based on the fundamental pillars of 'Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability, and Accountability' and focuses on making education accessible to everyone and elevating 'Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Groups' (SEDGs) in line with 'Sustainable Development Goal 4' (SDG4) to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030 while building upon India's tradition and value systems rooted in Indian ethos. The policy envisions a holistic and integrated education approach, focusing on skill development, multi-disciplinary learning, and promoting creativity and critical thinking. It emphasises using technology and digital resources to enhance the learning experience. The Policy reflects the principle that education must develop not only cognitive capacities but also social, ethical, and emotional capacities and dispositions.

The NEP 2020 has given special emphasis on life skills and vocational education through integration and mainstreaming of vocational education with general education which will help students in acquiring various skills to meet the requirements of employability and to improve the quality of education. The policy emphasises experiential learning, a pedagogical approach that creates concrete experiences that have a practical application of knowledge and skills to real-world experiences. The policy encourages value based education aiming at holistic personality development and character building of students with an eye on embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional values, promoting critical thinking, Indian Knowledge Systems, scientific temper, communication and soft skill as well as team work. Moreover, the policy proposes a "light but tight" regulatory framework to ensure integrity, transparency, and resource efficiency by virtue of which every stakeholder will have access to the necessary information.

As per the new policy, the undergraduate students have multiple entry and exit options. The students can drop out of their courses at any given point. On completing one year of the course, they will be receiving a certificate, on completing 2 years they will receive a diploma degree; and on completing 3 years, they will be having a degree in the course itself. The policy introduces the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) scheme that will allow higher education institutions to maintain a digital repository of credits earned by students. To put it simply, ABC Platform is a virtual database of credits to store online the academic credits earned by each student individually.

Lala Rural College is all set to implement and incorporate in its framework the basic guidelines as formulated by the NEP 2020 in the academic session 2023-24. The college has a plan of action to execute backed by its mission and vision.

#### **Admission Procedure**

Admission to the H.S. courses starts after the announcement of the H.S.L.C. examination result and to FYUG courses after the announcement of the result of the H.S. examination. The admission schedule is announced in accordance with the AHSEC / AU notifications.

The candidates securing not less than 40% marks in the last examination shall be considered eligible for admission to HS First-year and FYUG first semester.

- Students seeking admission to H.S. 1st year are to visit AHSEC online Admission portal (DARPAN) and submit an application along with the required documents selecting Lala Rural College.
- Students seeking admission to FYUG. 1<sup>st</sup> semester is advised to go to the Common Online Admission Portal of Assam University, Silchar accessible at <a href="http://auexamination.ac.in/admission">http://auexamination.ac.in/admission</a> and submit a n application along with the required documents selecting Lala Rural College. Thereafter, they are to submit application to the college portal and complete the procedure of fee payment.
- DHE's Unique Id is mandatory for every student both HS and Degree courses.
- The College, after getting details of the applicants, will notify the list of applicants in the website (www.lrcollege.org) of the college as well as in the Notice Board for verification of documents etc. and selection of candidates for admission. All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of the AHSEC/ AUS.
- With the introduction of NEP 2020, it is imperative for students to get themselves aware of ABC (Academic Bank of Credits) scheme of digital repository and then log in www.abc.gov.in in order to get their credits to be earned by them stored in the virtual database. Students are required to generate their ABC (Academic Bank of Credits) Id.

## Instructions and Terms & Conditions for Filling up the Online Application Form: 2023-24

- 1. Students willing to enrol themselves in Lala Rural College for FYUG programme need to apply online both in Assam University portal as well as Lala Rural College website respectively.
- 2. Online registration details are available on the University websites <u>https://ausexamination.ac.in/admission</u>.
- 3. Applicants willing to apply online for admission to various courses of are required to first register online and read the guidelines below carefully.
- 4. Download the instructions, read them carefully and save them for ready reference. Follow the guidelines during online filling of the application form. Click on "I have read the Instructions" button to proceed further.
- 5. On the landing Page (the webpage which opens after you click on the Admission link https://ausexamination.ac.in/admission). Please click on the "Applicant Login" button.
- 6. New Applicants should click on the blue button indicating "New Applicant? Create a New Account".
- 7. All the pieces of information required during registration of the new candidates ARE COMPULSORY and will have to be given.
- 8. Password of the candidate will have to be entered by the candidate as per the following rules:
  - a. Password should be minimum 6 characters and maximum 13 characters.
  - b. There should be at least one UPPER CASE character. c. There should be at least one LOWER CASE character.
  - c. There should be at least one NUMBER
  - d. There should be at least one SPECIAL CHARACTER (1 :@:#:&:%)
  - e. Example of Password: "Shukla@2020"
- 9. For submission of the form, filling up of "Captcha" is a must.
- 10. After filling up the form and clicking on the "Register" button, the candidate will receive an email with all the credentials for login:
  - a. User Name, which will be also the Application Number
  - b. Password, and
  - c. OTP
- 11. The candidate will be taken to the OTP Page where the Candidate will have to enter the OTP. After entering OTP, the candidate will be taken to the main Application Form.
- 12. Please remember your APPLICATION NUMBER & PASSWORD. These will be required for logging in to the Application Portal. If you forget the Application Number & Password, click on "Forget Password". The candidates are instructed to remember the phone no and email id used at the time of online registration.
- 13. Before filling up the form, it is suggested to the applicants that they should scan clearly the following documents (for uploading later) as per the size given below:
  - a. Candidate's Passport-size photograph Size Between 150 Kb to 300 kb
  - b. Candidate's Signature Size Max 30 Kb
  - c. Copies of other Testimonials Size 150 Kb to 300 kb each
- 14. In the 'mandatory upload' section, the applicant has to upload the following clearly readable documents:
  - a. Passport-size photograph of the applicant.

- b. Scanned signature of the applicant.
- c. Scanned copy of both sides of all original testimonials (Mark sheet/ Caste Certificate/Gap Certificate/NOC from Employer etc.(Candidates are advised to scan the Original Testimonials for uploading. Scanned copies of photocopied documents, should not be uploaded).
- 15. Please note that it is not compulsory to fill up the entire Application at onego. The application can be saved in the draft mode by clicking on **"Save As Draft**" button. Doing so will allow the information already entered to be saved. Applicants can save the forms in draft mode and can log in again for completing and submitting it.
- 16. All (\*) marked field on the application form are compulsory. The compulsory information will have to be given before Final Submission.
- 17. Applicants shall choose the Course in which she/he wishes to apply, based on the eligibility. The applicants are advised to check the eligibility criteria of the Courses before making a choice.
- 18. User/Applicant can change or edit information in the Application as long as the Application is not submitted. Once the application is submitted, the applicant cannot change or edit or modify the information. For any correction in the application form, the applicant will have to visit the respective College/ Department of the University. **Therefore, candidates are advised to fill up and check the application form carefully before final submission.**
- 19. Before the submission of the Application form, the applicant has to "upload the payment slip (if any, in case of FYUG/B.Ed/LL.B)/pay the application fee through the Payment Gateway (in case of University In-house Courses)" for final submission of the application form.
- 20. Only Paid Applications will be accepted for further processing after verification by college/university.
- 21. Applicants are requested to verify the Bank Account Details carefully before making payment. The University/Colleges will not be responsible for any wrong payment made by the applicant.
- 22. Application Fee (if any) once paid is non-refundable.
- 23. Applicants will be provisionally registered for admission, subject to the eligibility criteria and verification of Certificates, mark sheets and other credentials.
- 24. Applicants shall take the printout of the admission form and keep it with them for future reference.
- 25. The applicant will be solely responsible for providing correct and relevant information in the application form. In case of any discrepancy found during verification or at any later stage, the application will be rejected by the University/College and the admission of the applicant will be cancelled. Furnishing of incorrect information/suppression of information may lead to legal action against the applicant.

#### Pattern of unit tests

As per NEP 2020 framework, unit tests are part of formative assessment for students' academic progression. Unit tests are compulsory for the UG students of all clusters and will be held tentatively as per the following calendar: -

Odd Semester:1st Unit Test: In the month of September.<br/>2nd Unit Test: In the month of November.Even Semester:1st Unit Test: In the month of<br/>March.

2nd Unit Test: In the month of May.

Unit Test is a part of internal assessment with 20 marks prescribed for the written test, i.e., unit test and 10 marks for attendance forming a total of 30 marks for internal test.

### Guidelines for Four Year Undergraduate (UG) Programme as per National Education Policy-2020

UG curriculum framework shall be a Four Year UG programme (**FYUG**) as per curriculum structure provided in ANNEXURE-I. Students may choose FYUG programme either with Honours or Honours with research in concerned disciplines. After successful completion of six semesters ( $3^{rd}$  Year) of study in chosen discipline, students will have the option to opt honours in concerned discipline. If a student chooses honours with research option in  $4^{th}$  year, then the qualifying criterion is that he /she should obtain minimum 7.5 CGPA up to  $3^{rd}$  year with no arrear papers. For only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But **students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to**  $4^{th}$  year in any case. Students opting for research project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific Core papers in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree.

- For FYUG Programme, total credit requirement across eight semesters is 160 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) 80, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) 34, Inter-disciplinary Course (IDC) 9, Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) 8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) 9, Internship 2, Value Added Course (VAC) 6, Research Project/ Dissertation/ Additional 03 courses DSC 12.
- As there is a provision of lateral entry and exit, if student exits after three years then total credit requirement for Three Years Undergraduate (TYUG) Programme is 120 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) 60, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) 26, Inter-disciplinary Course (IDC) 9, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) 8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) 9, Internship 2, Value Added Course (VAC) 6.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester II (i.e., 1<sup>st</sup> year) and successfully obtain 40credits, then university will provide him/her Certificate in relevant discipline.
- If a student exits after completion of Semesters IV (i.e., 2<sup>nd</sup> year) and successfully obtain 80 credits, then university will provide him/her Diploma in relevant discipline.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester VI (i.e., 3<sup>rd</sup> year) and successfully obtain 120 credits, then university will provide him/her Three Years UG Degree in relevant discipline.

- In the context of Lala Rural College, following departments will offer FYUG programme (Honours only/ Honours with Research): English, Bengali, Manipuri, History, Political Science, Economics, Accountancy and Management.
- For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. Both DSC and DSM should be selected from the same cluster. Same subject cannot be selected as DSC and DSM. DSC from one cluster and DSM from another cluster are not allowed.
- Students shall have to opt for two DSM, one as first minor and the other as second minor. For DSM, students shall have to take two subjects related to his /her Discipline from the same cluster as of DSC.
- Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his or her core course only once after completion of second semester. However, if a student desires to change one of his/her minors to core paper, then automatic change in the minor should be done as the same subject cannot be opted asboth core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
- For IDC, Student have to opt any one subject from the bunching of Natural Science/Social Science/ Humanities/ Commerce and Management (ANNEXURE II) other than DSC and DSM subject. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
- **SEC** shall have **to be opted either from DSC or from DSM 1** i.e. first minor.
- Opting one literature as DSC and other literatures as DSM and IDC are not allowed.
- In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student.


